ALMONDS

Grow to approximately 4m-4.5m from \$74.95

All in One - This almond is great for the home garden. It produced heavy crops of soft-shelled nuts with sweet, flavoursome kernels. Needs less winter chilling than other varieties but a hot summer to ripen. Frost hardy.

Self-fertile

Self-Fertile - This variety is a self-pollinating almond, producing gorgeous blossoms in spring time. Produces heavy crops of soft-shelled almonds with a good, sweet flavour. **Self-fertile**

APPLES

This selection of apples is on MM106 rootstock - semi-dwarfing stock (3-3.5m). This rootstock is vigorous, resistant to woolly aphid

Ballerina Flamenco - This columnar, compact tree produces a truly stunning spring display with white pink-tinged blossoms & bronze-red new growth. In Summer masses of red over green apples decorate the tree and if processed make lovely 'jelly'. Narrow upright habit makes this a tree easy to place. Ripens in Summer.

Braeburn - Crisp, firm & juicy with yellowish green skin that is broadly striped with red. Sweet flavour balanced with a moderate tartness for just a little zing. Self-fertile. Ripen in May. **Self-fertile**

Bramley Seedling - A quintessentially English Heritage Apple. The fruit is large, flattish & green, flushed red. Firm light yellow flesh that is full of flavour. Ripe towards the end of Autumn. **Self-fertile**

Cox's Orange - One of the finest apples ever grown. Greenish-yellow skin with Orange-red striping. Rich, aromatic nutty flavour makes this older variety still hugely popular. Suitable for cooking or eating. Ripens Mid-February to Mid-March. **Self-fertile**

Divine - A red skinned apple with crisp, crunchy, juicy flesh with a firm texture. The tree itself has been bred for strong resistance to disease and is a perfect choice for organic gardens. Can highly recommend! **Ripens late** Summer. **Self-fertile**

Fuji - A Japanese variety with large fruit with a smooth red-shaded skin. The creamy white flesh is firm, juicy & sweet with a satisfying crunch when eaten fresh. Stores exceptionally well - for months if refrigerated. Ripe from mid-autumn onwards. **Self-fertile**

Granny Smith - Everyone's favourite! This classic bright green apple with its tangy flavour & crisp white flesh is suitable for eating or cooking. Keeps well. Very productive. Ripens February to April.

Gala - Crisp, crunchy white juicy flesh that is aromatic & tastes divine. Nice red blush to the yellow skin. Ripens in Summer around February. **Self-fertile**

Lady In Red - Luscious & flavoursome oblong fruit. A hardy grower, useful as a fruiting screen or hedge plant. It tolerates poor & exposed conditions. February to April for ripening. **Self-fertile.**

Monty's Surprise - A NZ apple with strong disease resistance and very large (up to 400grams) crisp & juicy fruit that are full of flavour. The skin of this apple has a high flavonoid count aiding human disease prevention. Ripens in April. **Self-fertile**

Pacific Rose - This NZ variety has distinctive, clear rose-pink skin. The flesh is firm, crisp & juicy with a rich-sweet taste. A Gala & Splendour cross, this apple reaches maturity mid-season. Ripens early March/April.

Priscilla - A Heritage apple with light yellow skin with a strong red blush. Crisp & juicy flesh with a good flavour. A vigorous grower that is resistant to apple 'black spot'. Ripens February-March. **Self-fertile**

Red Delicious - Classic, heart shaped, red shiny fruit. The perfumed, sweet & crispy flesh invites you to take one big delicious bite after another. Can be eaten straight off the tree or is ideal for pies and puddings. Ripens around March. **Self-fertile**

Royal Gala - One of NZ's most popular eating apples. Rosy red blushed skin. Creamy, fine textured flesh, crisp, sweet & juicy. Ripens from February to April. **Self-fertile**

APRICOTS

This selection of Apricots are on semi-dwarfing stock And will grow to 3m-3.5m from \$69.95

- Fitzroy** - Bred in Taranaki this Apricot has consistent crops of medium sized golden fruit that ripen around February. The fruit are sweet and juicy and the tree is self-fertile. Happiest in the sun with good drainage. We recommend pruning in Summer after harvesting, only prune on a warm dry day. **Self-fertile**
- Garden Annie** - Is an early season fruiting variety, with good sized bright yellow fruit that are firm & juicy as well as being semi-freestone. A highly ornamental tree that is semi-dwarf. **Self-fertile**
- Moorpark** – Soft, juicy, 'fuzz less' fruit of superb quality with a luscious flavour. Suitable for fresh eating straight off the tree but can also be bottled or dried. Likes a warm sunny position but is very cold tolerant. **Self-fertile**
- Royal Rosa** - This apricot is a vigorous grower and shows good disease resistance. The tree bears heavy crops from a young age & the fruit is sweet, low acid and delicious. Plant in a sunny sheltered position with good drainage. **Self-fertile**
- Trevatt** - Large, sweet, juicy, golden fruit with lots of flavour. Perfect for picking straight off the tree. We recommend pruning in summer after harvesting, only prune on a warm dry day. **Self-fertile**

BLACKBERRIES priced from \$19.95

Other varieties may be available during the year.

Black Satin - Black conical fruit with a lovely sweet flavour. Prefers well-drained soil. Self-fertile. Leave fruit on the plant for a week to gain full sweetness. Frost tolerant. Fruits February/March.

BLUEBERRIES

Partially self-fertile but pollination is assisted with correct pollinator. Choose any two different varieties for pollination. Varieties will vary during the season. Priced from \$27.95

Blue Dawn - This 'rabbit-eye' variety produces masses of large, tasty & delicious fruit. Generally, fruits from December through to February. Pollinate with another rabbit-eye.

Blue Magic – This 'rabbit-eye' variety produces copious amounts of delicious medium sized fruit. Thinning Of the fruit will encourage larger berries. Fruits December to February.

Blue Muffin - A variety that produces heavy crops of medium sized fruit that you can harvest in & around December, then again in March and April.

Pink Icing - Pink Icing® is a new dwarf Blueberry with breath-taking colourful foliage and dainty clusters of white bell-shaped flowers with shell pink overtones (with a faint fragrance) hanging below the branches in Mid-Spring.

Powder Blue - The sweet berries are of a good size & high quality & produced in generous quantities between January & March.

Tasty Blue - Rounded deep blue juicy berries, preceded by pink-tinged white flowers in spring. A spreading to an upright growth habit, with bronze autumn-winter toning's. This variety is suitable for all regions in New Zealand, either in the garden or as a container plant.

BOYSENBERRIES – PRICED FROM \$26.95

Tasman - Generally more trailing than blackberries, with a sweeter taste and richer colour. Can be tamed by fence or frame. Ideal fresh or for preserves. Huge fruit ripening at Christmas. **Self-fertile.**

Thornless Jewel - White flowers appear in spring, followed by large firm conical dark red/black berries with an old-fashioned boysenberry flavour, juicy and sweet. This boysenberry is moderately vigorous with thornless canes. Huge fruit ripening at Christmas. **Self-fertile.**

ELDERBERRIES

Elderberries are attractive & easy to grow. Ideal for the home gardener. Elderberries contain more phosphorus & potassium than any other temperate fruit crop. Ripen in Late Summer. **From \$32.95**

GOOSEBERRIES

Cape Gooseberry - Delicate yellow, bell-shaped flowers with dark purple spotting are followed by round yellow–orange fruit enclosed in a papery husk or “lantern”. The fruit has waxy skin and juicy pulp filled with tiny seeds. A small, sprawling plant with grey-green, velvety, heart-shaped leaves. Crops from Summer-Autumn. Delicious eaten fresh or used in desserts, pies, jams and sauces. **Priced from \$19.95**

Invicta - Heavy bearing, with large flavourful fruit that can be used for culinary purposes or eating when fully ripe. Ripens around December-January. **From \$29.95**

MULBERRY

Morus Nigra - This Black Mulberry has sweet, intense, blackish red fruit which mature in late Spring/Early Summer. Quite juicy. Good flavour. Lovely heart shaped, glossy green leaves dress the well-shaped ornamental tree. Quite easy to grow in a sunny position. **\$39.95**

White Mulberry - Morus Alba Pendula - Desirable, weeping form. The glossy large heart shaped leaves always look fresh. Small edible fruits appear in spring and are loved by humans & birds alike. **From \$89.95**

RASPBERRIES

Priced from only \$19.95 – All are self-fertile

More varieties will be available during the season.

Aspiring – Large, dark red, conical, firm fruit with excellent flavour. This raspberry is a dual cropper meaning it will fruit both in Summer & Autumn. A strong and productive plant, producing strong, upright, semi-thornless stems. Spreads fast and is one of the easiest of all to grow.

Ivory - Raspberry Ivory™ has yellow-golden medium firm fruit with an excellent flavour. They are covered with rose-type leaves. Small white flowers are followed by luscious, sweet, delicate fruit. Vigorous and productive plant, which spreads fast and is one of the easiest of all to grow. Canes are vigorous, with a high number of strong upright canes.

Harvesting from December to April, with the main crop in February and March.

Kaituna – Vigorous & productive plant, which spreads fast and is one of the easiest of all to grow.

Canes are vigorous, with a high number of strong upright canes. Harvest is early season, Dec-Jan.

Lewis - High yields of large firm medium, sweet, red fruit. Plant has few spines and it is of medium vigour. Best in a sunny spot and rich soil. Prune back to fresh buds in late winter.

Waiau – This plant produces light to medium red fruit with an excellent flavour. It is covered with rose-type leaves. Small white flowers that are followed by luscious, sweet, delicate fruit. Vigorous & productive plant, with many semi-upright canes that must be attached to wire or fence for support. Dormant canes are light brown with soft spines. Harvest all summer long; the berries are easily removed when ripe.

Waimea - Has very large, firm, glossy red conical fruit with an excellent delicious flavour. Produces sweet, delicate fruit. More contained growth than other raspberry varieties. Harvest is in summer, when the berries are easily removed when ripe. Semi-thornless.

CHERRY TREES

This Selection of Cherry Trees are on a Colt Rootstock & should grow to approximately 4m. Priced from \$73.00

Burlatt - Sweet Cherry - High quality First cherry of the season. Large heart shaped fruit with juicy soft sweet dark red flesh. Use fresh, jams, jellies, preserves or dessert. Ripens November. **Pollinator – Lapins**

Compact Stella - One of the best-known Sweet Cherries. Heavy & regular bearer of large dark red fruit. The tree is smaller than most other cherry varieties, perfect for those with more limited space. Suitable for warmer climates. Crops December/January. **Self-fertile.**

Dawson - Sweet Cherry. Dawson has dark black coloured skin and dark, sweet, red flesh. large sized fruit. Plant your Cherry in a sunny spot with good drainage. Ripens around December. **Self-fertile**

Lapins - Sweet Cherry - This heritage variety of Cherry is one of the largest and juiciest with firm dark red fruit that are sweet & delicious. Good resistance to skin splitting & a reliable producer. Ripens in January.

Self-fertile

Rainier - Sweet Cherry - A cross between Bing & Van cherry varieties the combination of these two red cherries produced a golden yellow cherry with a red blush & incredibly sweet flavour. Large white fleshed midseason cherry. Excellent eating. Ripens in January. **Pollinator – Dawson**

Stella - Sweet Cherry. A very popular commercial variety that can be grown in the home orchard. Large, dark, black-red, heart-shaped cherries that taste absolutely delicious. Prolific and regular crops. Plant in a sunny spot. Ripens in December. **Self-Fertile**

CHESTNUTS

Castanea 1005 - Commercial fruiting variety. Large, red-brown nuts fall free of the burr. A heavy-cropper bearing nuts in early-autumn. Strong, upright-grower. Self-fertile. **From \$69.95**

CITRUS

A smaller selection of Dwarf Citrus trees are available. This range will vary during the season.

GRAPEFRUIT – From \$44.95

Cutler's Red - has large, deep orange, sweet, juicy fruit with just a little zing. The rind is thick.

Fruits in Winter-Spring.

Golden Special - has large juicy seedless fruit. Ideal for breakfast fruit, juicing & also makes delicious Marmalade.

Fruits in July-November.

Morrison Seedless – This citrus tree produces medium to large, round, thin skinned, moderately sweet, juicy fruit, maturing August. Holds well on tree. Vigorous, large & prolific bearer.

Wheneey - This Australian variety has large, good quality, pale yellow fruit. The fruit has thin skin & very juicy flesh with a mild flavour. More suited for juicing. Harvest November to March.

LEMONS – From \$44.95

Lemonade – An interesting fast-growing Hybrid lemon which has medium sized pale-yellow fruit. Easy to peel, mild flavour. Excellent for Summer drinks. Fruits Late Winter to Early Spring.

Lisbon – One for the lemon connoisseur, deliciously juicy, fragrant fruit with a thick skin. Very productive & vigorous. Fruits Late Winter to Early Spring.

Meyer – N Z's most popular lemon & deservedly so. The clean, dark green foliage forms a medium sized plant with waxy white fragrant flowers, which appear in Spring, Summer & Autumn. The tree will produce tasty, juicy lemons.

Villa Franca - Thornless & a smaller tree than Lisbon. Prolific & bears a heavy crop. Fruits July-December.

Yen Ben – Profuse producer of large oval shaped fruit with a distinctive sharp acidic flavour. Very juicy & has few seeds. The skin is fragrant & firm. Ripens July-December.

LIMES– From \$44.95

Bearr's - A citrus tree known for its fruit, ornamental foliage & fragrant flowers. It is neat & compact in habit & almost thornless tree. Its fruit are small, thin skinned, deep green-turning yellow with seedless, juicy tangy flesh. Fruits in June to August and again in February/March.

Finger Lime – Rarely available - Known as the caviar of citrus with deliciously aromatic, smooth pebbled skin, with a crisp lemon lime flavour combination. This is a versatile fruit for the kitchen whether used for marmalade, flavouring spice, eaten fresh or used to garnish other foods.

Kaffir - Great for Thai cooking & have long been used for their leaves that are finely cut up & fruit for its zest, in Thai food. They add a distinctive flavour to any meal.

Key/Mexican Lime - This lime variety produces small, thin-skinned fruit that ripens to a yellow or yellowish-green. Its continuous blooming allows for a steady harvesting in June to August & again in February/March.

Sublime – Sublime has a low seed content & prolific fruiting habit. Large, thin skinned juicy fruit. Harvest fruit late summer to early autumn.

Tahitian - A an almost round pale, medium-sized greenish-yellow fruit with yellow/green juicy pulp. It has a distinct lime aroma & flavour. Seedless. A vigorously hardy tree with drooping branches, nearly thorn free. Use fruit in garnishes, drinks & juicing & dressings. Harvest in late autumn through to late winter.

Citrus continued..... MANDARINS– From \$44.95

Afourer – It develops a highly attractive deep orange-red colour & is easy to peel. It is a very flavoursome.
Harvest August through to mid-October.

Burgess Scarlet –Medium sized, rich flavoured, aromatic fruit that is easy to peel. The fruit is mature from June - August. Quite vigorous in habit but nice & bushy.

Clementine – A popular early maturing variety that has small, sweet juicy fruit of good colour & flavour.
Harvest April-August.

Encore - These Mandarins' fruit from Nov-Feb. The fruit are medium in size & easy to peel, sweet & juicy.

Kiyomi - Fruit is large like an orange, thick skinned & easy to peel. Flesh is juicy & seedless. Satsuma type ripening August-September.

Miho - 'Miho' is very early ripening with fruit ready to eat from April/May. The easy peel, flat fruit has a mild sweet taste.

Satsuma - Is a popular, sweet, seedless, easy peel variety. Best picked as the fruit becomes puffy, when left on tree. Ideal for the lunchbox. Fruits May - July.

ORANGES – From \$44.95

Best Seedless – A good quality NZ orange with sweet & juicy, seedless fruit. Ripens from September onwards.
Chock full of Vitamin C.

Blood Orange - A natural pigment not usually present in citrus, changes the colour of the flesh to a crimson-blood red colour. The fruits are small-medium sized. Fruits July-August.

Fukumoto - 'Fukumoto' is an attractive Navel orange with large round fruit with quite a strong reddish tinge to the rind. Sweet tasting and delicious it ripens in late winter. Quite a compact grower. Ripens in late Winter.

Harwood Late - produces thin skinned, juicy oranges with an excellent flavour that ripen from Autumn onwards.
Good vigorous upright habit.

Parent Navel – This kiwi classic has a light orange skin; excellent flavour & its flesh is juicy sweet. While in flower its blossoms emit a gorgeous fragrance. Good vigorous upright habit. Fruits in August – December.

Seville - Very old variety, very sour. Ideal for marmalades & preserves. Fruits July to September.

Washington Navel - A firm favourite for Citrus lovers. This large, sweet seedless fruit has an excellent flavour & plenty of juice. Ripening around July/August the mature fruit will hold well on the tree for several months.
Plant in well-drained soil in a sunny sheltered position.

CURRANTS

Priced from \$19.95

Black Currant – Laxton Tinker - A consistent heavy cropper bearing fruit that are ready to harvest in mid-Summer and has good resistance to disease. Plant in full sun or partial shade where soils are suitably moist, fertile and free-draining.

Red Currants - Currants can be grown as a free-standing bush or hedge. Strings of lacelike attractive small flowers appear in early spring, followed by strings of bright red shiny berries that can be harvested in early December. Eat fresh or freeze whole, make into jelly, jam, juice or add to ice cream, cordial and liqueur.

FEIJOA'S

Varieties may vary during the season. If there is a particular variety that you are after – please inquire. Any two different varieties will pollinate each other - From \$19.95 each

Anatoki - A desirable new variety that fruits early in the season around March-April. The fruit are exceptionally sweet, large and round. As with all Feijoas will fruit best when 2 different Feijoa's are planted. Likes a sunny sheltered position.

Den's Choice – An early season variety with medium to large, sweet flavoured fruit. Ready to harvest in April/May.

Kaiteri – The Kaiteri have large, very sweet fruit of this new variety. It is ready early in season too - towards the end of February so lots of yum for your tum while in the sun. Plant with another Feijoa for best results. Likes a sunny well drained spot.

Pounamu - One of the best feijoas for taste, with a rich, smooth aromatic flavour. Early cropper with dark-green skin, almost the colour of greenstone. Ripens April/May.

Sellowiana Giant - Luscious & flavoursome oblong fruit. A hardy grower, useful as a fruiting screen or hedge plant. Ideal as a hedge. Prefers free draining conditions. Harvest from March to June.

Triumph - Medium sized fruit with firm skin and good flavour. The flesh is moderately soft & juicy. Self-fertile variety but more abundance of crops with a partner. Ripens in Mid to late around April to May.

Unique - Large crops of medium-sized fruit with soft, smooth & juicy flesh. Crops from a younger age than other Feijoa cultivars. Early season, ripens April.

White Goose - This large, vigorous growing Feijoa produces a heavy crop of large with semi-smooth light green skin around April-May.

FIGS

These selections should grow to Approximately 3-4 metres.

Brown Turkey - This fruiting fig is highly ornamental as well as productive. Large glossy green foliage & a vigorous growth habit with large fruit that are purplish brown with pink flesh & a rich flavour. A favourite fig for jam & preserving. Fruit ripens in Autumn. **Self-fertile**

Brunoro – A highly ornamental tree that produces delicious fruit twice throughout the year in January & April. The fruit is purple-black with a succulent red flesh. **Self-fertile**

Mrs. Williams – This fig is a very attractive tree that has the bonus of two crops of large fruit per year in January & April. The fruit is dark brown with red flesh & delicious. **Self-fertile**

Sweet Black - The fig tree is highly ornamental as well as providing us with a delicious edible fruit. Broad lobed glossy green foliage and sweet fruit that ripens around March. **Self-fertile**

GRAPES

Feed every 4 months with either Citrus food or Acid food if planted in the ground.

Plant in a sunny position where soils are free-draining.

Prune as required during Winter. From \$29.95

Albany Surprise - A popular NZ selection, and one of the best-known varieties for table grapes. A prolific producer of very sweet, black grapes with a good, traditional flavour. Tough skin and does contain seeds, but has very good disease resistance. Mid-season, harvest March-April. **Self-fertile**

Canadice Seedless - A delicious grape with a thin dark red skin. The grapes are seedless have a lovely delicate flavour. Crops well with medium sized bunches that are ripe in Summer. The vine shows good disease resistance. **Self-fertile**

Lakefront Seedless - Produces large bunches of sweet, seedless green grapes that are usually ready to harvest in & around February & March. **Self-fertile**

Niagara - One of the most popular varieties of table grape. Large, very juicy, sweet fruit with a thin skin & low seed count. Early season, harvest late February-March. **Self-fertile From \$49.95**
